This allowed the CBCPAC to invest more than \$6 million dollars directly into the 2020 election cycle with \$2 million dollars going into an independent expenditure, \$2 million+ more invested with partner organizations, and another \$2 million+ dollars given directly to candidate campaigns. The CBCPAC aims to protect the sitting Members of the Congressional Black Caucus, elect new Members who will be allies for the CBC's legislative priorities and candidates who will encourage, engage and excite voters to ensure they participate in the electoral process.
